Subject: Reduction in litigations filed in CAT on the grounds of inaction – reg.

Sir/Madam,

Board has issued detailed instructions vide letter F.No.C-18012/6/2013-Ad.IIB dated 09.05.2016 for effective and timely handling of Court cases filed by employees of CBEC.

2. It has been observed that a number of litigations are filed in CATs on the ground of inaction by Cadre Controlling Authorities on the representations of applicants, inspite of directions on the matter.

3. It is imperative that litigations are reduced by taking action in time on any representation made by employees to their respective CCAs. All CCAs are directed to ensure that representations submitted in pursuance of CAT orders must be disposed of within the laid down time limit. In cases where any case is filed in CAT on grounds of inaction on a representation pursuant to any CAT order, the responsibility for this lapse will have to be fixed.

4. Keeping this in view, it is expected that all CCAs will ensure compliance of all CAT/Court orders relating to disposal of representations well before the timeline given in the CAT/Court order.
